“Brain injuries in partner violence: An overlooked danger exacerbated by COVID-19”

Dr. Valera will discuss research on the underlying neurobiology and relationship of clinical symptoms to traumatic brain injury in abused women, with the goal of translating this knowledge into better clinical care and understanding.

The general public appears to be largely unaware of this issue and/or unsure of how to address it. There has been a growing recognition of the need for research and education in this area. More immediately, COVID-19 effects and mitigation strategies have been linked to surges in intimate partner violence globally.

Dr Eve M. Valera is a cognitive neuroscientist with extensive training in clinical neuropsychology, psychopathology and traumatic brain injury (TBI). She developed dual interests in attention deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) and trauma (particularly in the form of domestic violence). Her research uses neuroimaging with a focus on understanding the neurobiology of ADHD and partner-related TBI.

She has authored many articles on this topic and has won awards such as the 2020 Robert D. Voogt Founders Award.
